Greetings St. Anselm Families,

What a rainy week we are having! As we prepare for October, we have many things to look forward to! Here are some reminders from my desk.

This Friday marks the mid-way point of first quarter. Time flies and this month was no exception. The teachers will be working on grades in PowerSchool and you will be able to see the most updated information online. Please check grades! Continue to communicate with your student's teachers. I firmly believe that education is a partnership. Our teachers can not educate without parental support. To raise children takes a village.

If you see that your student has not started out in the best way when it comes to grades, sit down and come up with a plan to move forward. Planners should be filled out everyday, and students can use highlighters or colored pens for different subjects and responsibilities. Create a checklist that has to be complete each night before bed. Get to bed early and allow a few extra minutes in the mornings. Check PowerSchool with your student and ask about missing assignments. If there is confusion, contact the teacher first. If you feel that the situation is severe, contact our counselor, Mrs. Rivard for further assistance. If everyone continues to keep updated on daily occurrences, there are no crazy surprises when report card time comes.

Next week is an IMPORTANT week at St. Anselm- IOWA Standardized testing. Each homeroom teacher has been planning out testing schedules for the better part of two weeks at this point. Each student in our building will spend the week taking the IOWA tests which include all subject matters. The students do not test all day, every day, but for the better part of some days. The teachers plan to ensure that the students' test schedule is fair and balanced.

The purpose of the IOWA test is to show the grade levels our students are testing at. After the IOWA scoring is complete, each parent will receive an outline of the testing results and we, as a school staff, will review what we need to do to improve. I urge you to encourage your student(s) to relax and remember to take their time. Students should be patient and calm, and focus on each question. Please make sure that students get proper sleep at night and eat breakfast in the morning. There is no way to study for the test. Our teachers have been reviewing and discussing vocabulary and concepts that may show up on the tests. We wish each student the best and know that our Stags will work hard and earn great scores!

Please know how much I appreciate all of the parent support that we receive from you. St. Anselm has a wonderful parent base and I truly appreciate each family who belongs to our parish and school.
