Greetings St. Anselm Families,

I hope everyone is doing well and adjusting to being back to school for the year!

Thus far, our students have done very well getting back on a schedule and following the directions of their teacher(s). It usually takes a few weeks to get back to getting up earlier and following the clock throughout the day.

Here are a few reminders and updates from my desk.

On Friday, we will celebrate our first liturgy as a school. We will also welcome **Fr. Stephen Pullis**, from the Archdiocese of Detroit Office of Catholic Schools. **He will celebrate mass at 8:30 and then will meet with me to take a tour of the building and meet our students.** Fr. Pullis recently took over the lead role when it comes to decision-making for our local Catholic Schools. It is a wonderful gesture for him to come to our church, celebrate mass, and get to know our students and faculty. As always, you are welcome to join us for mass on Friday.

Remember that your student(s) need to be in the appropriate uniforms every day. SchoolBelles is the only company that we go through. Each student needs uniform bottoms, polo shirts, dress socks, and shoes are on regular days. On gym days, they need their sweatpants or shorts, and their t-shirt or sweatshirt with the Stag logo. Our students do not wear uniforms to make things complicated, but instead, to make things easier. If your student does not have the appropriate uniform on, a write-up will come home. After three, I will be calling home. I suggest that uniforms are laid out the night before to avoid any questions or complications in the morning.

As always, we welcome parents into our building while our students are in their classes and learning. We have so much going on each day-- preschool is half and full day, lunch moms and dads come in and out, and our students change classes and go out for recess. **If you have to come over to the school for any reason, you must buzz in at the middle door and come right to the office. We want our students to be safe and we want our teachers to be able to educate without interruption.** That can not happen if parents or students are constantly in and out. After the bell rings at 7:50 am and until 3:00 pm, students are in class and learning. Any message, snack, lunch, or belonging can be delivered through the office staff and not through the parents. I appreciate your cooperation with this.

Parents are always welcome to bring in birthday treats for their students. As a friendly reminder, you may want to touch base with your child's teacher to make sure there are no class allergies and that you are making or buying the correct amount of treats. Only send in the amount needed for the classroom! Remember-- we have small class sizes, so dozens of cupcakes are unnecessary!

As we continue through September, we will send home information about clubs and tutoring. Look for that toward the end of the month. Before October hits, you will also receive a letter about IOWA testing. And lastly, thank you for your patience with our technology issues this past week. Our emails and website are back up and running, and PowerSchool is being fixed as I type!
