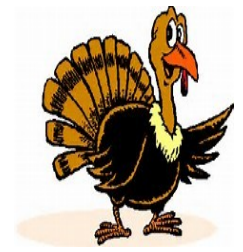

Happy Thanksgiving! Since we will not have a School Scope next week, I want to take a moment to wish you and your family a happy Thanksgiving. I am very thankful for St. Anselm and for all of the people who make my life better each day. I always pray for our school families and our parishioners. I appreciate the support you give to the school, to our staff, and to our students. I hope that your break is a healthy and happy one.

Attached to this scope, you will find information about our upcoming raffle. Each year, we choose a worthy cause to donate to. This year, we will be giving back in the forms of donations to All Saints Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry in Detroit. Our middle school students travel with me, and other staff members, to volunteer time and serve the less fortunate. It is apparent, in visiting, that they are lacking in food, supplies, and cold weather/clothing items. We will start our raffle, with our awesome and unique prizes, in about a week and a half. The proceeds from the raffle will go to the soup kitchen to buy the items I mentioned above.

We will also have a collection for blankets, cold weather items, clothing, food, and some toiletries. These things can be sent in to your students homeroom. We will take all donated items to the soup kitchen on December 7, and then the remaining items will be taken with our monetary donation on February. Thank you, in advance, for your help with this.

I have one change to our schedule. **On Friday, December 8, we will have a half day of school with an 11:05am dismissal.** Our entire staff will spend the afternoon in a professional development. On December 8, we will go to mass at 8:30am. All are welcome. It is the feast day of the Immaculate Conception. Our bell will ring for pick-up at 11:05. We will offer latchkey that day from 11:05am-6:00pm for families who need it.

On Sunday, a message went out requesting help with the Christmas Concert. Mr. Lurie is in need of a parent or two, that could come in and rehearse with the students during lunch and recess.
